How to read chord symbols:

- Left vertical line represents string closest to you
- Right vertical line represents string furthest from you
- A black dot represents a fretted note
- A "o" at the top of the symbol means the string is played open
- A "x" at the top of the symbol means the string is not played
- Watch for fret numbers beside the symbol to define the starting point
- Numbers below represent finger to use (also can appear beside or in place of dots)

Strum: D D U ___ U D U

- Keep steady D U D U motion going through out
- Create strumming pattern by varying when strings are hit or missed

Intro:

|G \ \ \ |G \ \ \ |C \ \ \ |D \ \ \ Repeat
 Here, each chord letter and "/" represents 1 beat of strumming

Verse:

G C D
 Another turning point a fork stuck in the road,
 G C D
 Time grabs you by the wrist, and directs you where to go
 Em D C G
 So make the best of this test and don't ask why
 Em D C G
 Its not a question but a lesson learned in time
 Here, chords are lined up over corresponding lyric

Chorus:

Em G Em G
 Its something unpredictable but in the end its right
 Em D G (from intro)
 I hope you had the time of your life
