

PENNY ON THE FLOOR by The Clarks

Each chord below is 1 strumming pattern...in other words "G ///" is one strumming pattern
"C /// C ///" would be two.

Intro:

Strumming: D D (Rest) U D U

G/// D/// C/// G/// D/// D/// C/// C///

Verse:

Strumming: D (Rest) D D U

G/// D/// C/// G///
There's a penny on the floor and I'm wise, I try to see in your eyes.

D/// D/// C/// C/// (Intro Strum for last two C's..two strumming patterns)

But all I see is a reflection of my face.

Chorus:

Strumming: D DU D DU

G/// D///
There's a penny on the floor, and you're standing at the door
em/// C/// G/// D/// C/// C///

turn around and say goodbye. A woman like you comes around just once a life.

(strum C twice and let ring for 6 more; 8 counts total)

Bridge:

Strumming: Strum first chord twice (both down); then strum second chord once and let ring for 6 counts

1st chord: D D

2nd chord: D (2 3 4 5 6)

Em / C / / / / /

Penny on the floor.

Em / D / / / / /

I'm tired of the war.

Em / C / / / / /

Penny on the track.

Em / D / / / / /

Are you comin' back?

Em actually happens during last two beats of previous section

When going to Bridge only play six beats of C, then the first two beats of Em in the Bridge

In other words: "C /// C / Em / C / / / / /" etc.
